

## **Introduction to OMHS Newsletter index 1998-2012**

The object of this index is to enable local history and family history researchers to access the useful information, relating to Chipping Ongar and the surrounding parishes, which is contained within these newsletters. Much of this information has been obtained from other available printed sources, but some is from archive material and some (perhaps the most important) from the unrecorded memories of local individuals.

This index is necessarily selective and does not cover general articles, or families which have no direct connection with the area. A few exceptions have been made; for example, the astonishing number of distant cycling and other clubs which visited the Cock Tavern have been indexed as this information is unlikely to be available elsewhere. Other items omitted include the social activities of the Ongar Millennium History Society. The intention of this index is to focus on topics of historical interest in the immediate area, and on personal names. A small number of corrections have been made where there is an obvious error in the original, and I have added a little additional information, such as first names, where these had been omitted in the original account.

As a regular user of indexes, I know that cross references within the index are useful, and I have attempted to include some which I think would be useful. But the indexers lot is not a happy one, and I realise that these attempts will certainly not satisfy everyone. However most would agree that a bad index is better than no index at all, so I hope that my sins of omission, as well as the unavoidable ones of commission, will be forgiven.
